We will split into breakout rooms to share and pray. In the Headingley room this week we'll give more time to prayer and less to sharing on this occasion, and focus outwards as well as (quite properly) praying for ourselves. New Series

The message on Sunday marks the beginning of a new series that should, God willing, take us through to just before Easter. We will be looking at selected passages from the Old Testament books of 1 and 2 Samuel. The series is entitled 'Living as the People of God in Challenging Times'. The first three messages are on the first three chapters of 1 Samuel. As well as True Prayer we'll consider 'True Praise' (1 Samuel 2) and 'True Faith' (1 Samuel 3). I'm really excited by this series. The people of God were facing all manner of difficulties, and faith in the nation was at a low ebb. Passage after passage brings us teaching which points forward to Jesus and helps us live creatively and faithfully as gospel people in 'such a time as this'.

Next Sunday (24 February) Jill Jones will be preaching as we continue the series, and we'll also be aiming to have some live prayers. So, for those who engage with the service in real time on a Sunday morning the prayers won't be pre-recorded but given at the moment. This is a trial to see if we can make this work. More details will be forthcoming in the pastoral update next week.
