

Pastoral Update 26.03.2021

Welcome to this week's pastoral update as we prepare for Holy Week. Let's celebrate together and pray for God to work in our church, our nation, and our world.

1. Cragg Prayer Space

On this Palm Sunday weekend we also come to the culmination of our 21 Days of Prayer for 2021 initiative.

As previously announced, on Saturday (27 March) there will be a Cornerstone Prayer Space @Cragg Hill, from 10 am - 4.00 pm. This is a 6 Hour space for private prayer. Hannah Childs has set up prayer stations and a team of stewards will be in place to keep the event Covid secure. A maximum of two households or bubbles can be in the space at a time with an upper limit of 9 people in total. The time will be divided into 30-minute slots.

Booking is essential and is through this link. But there are still slots available and we encourage you to take the opportunity to come to what is our first in person event since the third national

2. Zoom Sunday Service

A reminder that we're meeting together on Zoom this Sunday, the first time we have tried this for a Sunday service. **Zoom into Church will be live rather than pre-recorded, with Gideon and Hannah 'on air' from 10.00 am.**

The service will begin at 10.30 am, with a special Palm Sunday call to worship (if you have something to wave, a Palm Cross or Kate Burkett's Palm Sunday craft, I encourage you to have it with you. Something green to

wave would work well too). I will lead and give a short message, and then, integrated into the service, Jill and Colin Jones will lead communion. Please have bread and wine / grape juice available. There will be plenty of opportunity for prayer, both altogether and in breakout rooms.

Please note that the service itself will be more adult focused, with Zoom into Church being more children / family focused. I say this to give families the opportunity to plan how they are going to engage with the morning. I look forward to seeing many of you at 10.00 am for Zoom into Church, and many more at 10.30 am for the service.
