

Pastoral Update 23/04/2021

1. This Sunday's Services

This Sunday's (25th April) Online Service

Scott Halligan (Headingley) is leading, Ed and Sophie Borrett (Connect@Copperbeech) are leading sung worship, Kate Burkett is leading the all age talk, Ruth Goater (Connect@Copperbeech) is leading prayers, Anna Sweeney (Cragg) is reading God's word, and I am speaking. We begin a new series on some passages from the opening chapters of Revelation. Sometimes we're put off studying this book, as it can seem strange and threatening. But it's wonderful good news, full of encouragement as we seek to follow Jesus today. This week's reading is Revelation 1.1-8 and we'll think about the character of God and how this is great news for us.

These are always great times and are brilliantly stewarded. I encourage you not to be afraid to book on. Because we are outside we are now able to sing! I know that when this happened on Easter Sunday it was hugely significant for many: the opportunity to sing with a group of God's people for the first time in some while.

This Sunday Duncan is leading and I'm speaking, on the same passage I'll speak from at the online service, Revelation 1.1-8. God is in control of our world, he is present with us by his Spirit, and Jesus sends us out to engage in cross-shaped mission. These verses contain a real message for our times and I hope we'll be able to hear it loud and clear on Sunday, whether we're hearing it online or in person.

2. Next Week's Services

On Sunday 2nd May we have an in-person service at Headingley and this will also be live streamed as the online service. This is the first time we've done this and so I especially ask you to pray, not just for those 'up front' but for all behind the scenes, especially for Nathan Shipley and Adrian Howe. For the service itself, Chris Dyson is leading, Matthew Newman and team are leading sung worship, Nathan Shipley is leading an all-age talk, Sue Ricketts is leading prayers, Meenakshi Rao is reading God's word, and I am speaking on the second passage in our Revelation series, Revelation 1.9-20.

Transforming Lives for Good

At the last positive and exciting church meeting we decided to actively explore having a TLG education centre on our Headingley site.

Things are now moving forward to the next stage. Kate Churchill and I have met with Jack Carter from TLG. We will be signing a Memorandum of Understanding, setting up an Initial Action Group, and taking part in a feasibility study which will consider whether we're a suitable partner for TLG as well as exploring whether there's a need for an education centre in our area.

Kate will be acting as point person for us at this stage of the project and drawing together the Initial Action Group. Thank you to those of you who have offered to be involved in this. Kate will be in touch, and we'll also be approaching different people directly.

The next four to five months are likely to be crucial for the success or failure of the project. Please do pray that God's guidance is clear.
